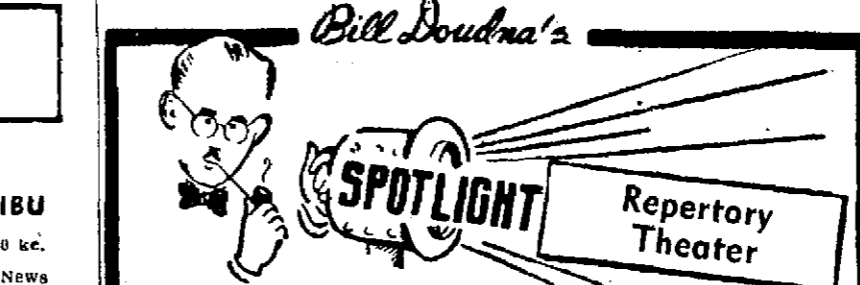

A HIGHLY AMUSING PLAY, "Springtime for Henry," opened Madison's summer theater season Wednesday night when the Repertory Theater began its second series in the Woman's bldg.

Here was a comedy which could lead itself to either of two types of performance. Director Don Soule and his cast chose to play it in the slick manner of, say a Noel Coward rather than to give it the full farcical treatment.

The result was a pleasant evening of smiles and controlled laughter rather than one of guffaws.

With only four actors to manipulate, Soule gave the play plenty of movement without excessive running about and without letting it sound talky.

There was a fifth member of the cast, Joan Keiser, but all she did was pace across the stage in the first scene, her flight helping to set up the character of Henry Dewlip, the center of interest.

Robert Loper, newcomer to Madison, played the middle-aged Dewlip, a roue who becomes transformed under the ministrations of his new secretary, Miss Smith. The Californian performed his role in all seriousness and with remarkably fine timing.

Emmy Bunks played the secretary, a straitlaced, matter-of-fact girl with such sincerity that when the facts of Miss Smith's past emerged, they were suitably surprising.

Donald Robinson was perfect as Dewlip's harebrained friend, a Wild-ish caricature of British manners, and Marjorie Schaffer, another dependable player, was equally good as his worldly, plain-spoken wife.

The plot was of the slightest kind. It's strength was in the hilarious scenes it provoked—Dewlip making love clumsily to his friend's wife, after issuing a suitable warning; Robinson, as the friend, expounding a mangled version of the story of Andromeda and Perseus; his wife spouting invective, and Dewlip, grotesquely clothed after a bad night, solving everybody's problems.

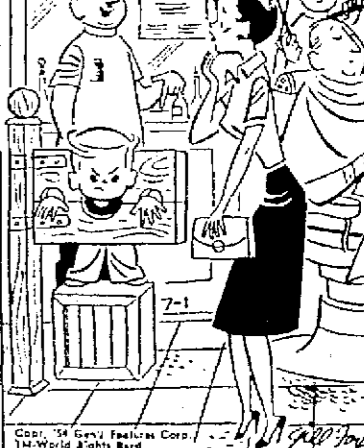
Featured attraction will be Scott, cowboy ventriloquist, with his side-kick, Luke McLuke.
