UN GROUP TO DISCUSS REDS' A-PLAN MONDAY

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Oct. 8.—(AP) With the United States and Russia in agreement, the UN Political Committee today decided unanimously to take up Monday the question of disarmament and Moscow's new atomic proposals.

Holding its first meeting of this General Assembly to agree on its order of work, the committee, made up of 80 top delegates, put next on its work sheet the question of collective measures against aggression.

Next came President Eisenhower's plan for using atoms for peace. Diplomatic sources reported that was the way the United States wanted it. They said the United States has been moving urgently behind the scenes to keep the Eisenhower plan separate from the disarmament and Russian plans, even to the extent of putting the relatively unimportant issue of collective measures between them.

TONGAY BACK IN MIAMI

MIAMI, Fla., Oct. 8.—(AP) Russell Tongay, 39-year-old swimming instructor under a 10-year prison sentence for the manslaughter death of his aquatut daughter, Kathy, returned today from Nassau, Bahamas, where he had been for three days.

Tongay, who is under \$5,000 bond pending an appeal, was accompanied by his son, Hubba, 8, who with Kathy formed the swimming team. Tongay declined to discuss his future plans. He denied the Bahamas government asked him to leave Nassau and said "we had the best trip to Nassau we ever had."

Mrs. Tongay, a Miami elementary school teacher, did not meet the plane bringing the Tongays to Miami.
