TURNING THE DIALS

Weber's Overture to "Der Freischutz," which opened the New York Philharmonic-Symphony first broadcast on CBS radio on Oct. 5, 1930, will be heard on the gala broadcast opening the orchestra's 25th consecutive season on the network this afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. The major portion of the broadcast will be devoted to a complete performance of Act 1 of Richard Wagner's "Die Walkure," with Astrid Varnay, soprano; Ramon Vinay, tenor; and Luben Vichey, basso, as soloists. The Philharmonic's only other complete performance of Act 1 was broadcast in December 1934 under the direction of Bruno Walter, with Lotte Lehmann, Paul Althouse and Emanuel List as soloists.

Among the highlights of the broadcast season will be the Brahms "German Requiem," conducted by Walter; the Verdi "Requiem," conducted by Cantelli; and the Beethoven Ninth Symphony under the direction of Mitropoulos. Eminent vocal soloists will be heard in these works. In the orchestra, the assisting chorus will be the Westminster Choir under the direction of Dr. John Finley Williams.

Joseph Seigel, the first soloist to broadcast with the New York Philharmonic-Symphony on CBS, on Oct. 19, 1930, will perform with the orchestra during Christmas week, playing the Mozart Violin Concerto in A major.

Other features of the coming broadcast season will be the first performance by the Philharmonic of the Haydn Symphony No. 96 in D major; a performance of the Brahms Double Concerto, played Isaac Stern, the violinist, and Leonard Rose, cellist; a concert dedicated to the United Nations on Sunday, Oct. 24; and the first American broadcast of the Variations on a Theme of Paganini by Boris Blacher, conducted by Szell.

Senator Is Guest
Senator Albert Gore (D-Tenn.) will discuss the problems of his office as the guest of Edgar Bergen on CBS radio's "Edgar Bergen Show with Charlie McCarthy" tonight at 8 o'clock. Mr. Bergen will introduce the Senator to Charlie McCarthy, who is expected to have some tricky questions for the legislator.

Davis to Return
Elmer Davis, news analyst and commentator, will return to WABC radio after a summer vacation, with a weekly 15-minute program of comment starting tonight at 10:15 o'clock.

34th Anniversary
This month WABC, America's first key radio network station begins its 34th year of broadcasting. Back in 1921, a couple of men spent hours daily in one half of the ladies' lounge in the Newark Westinghouse meter works. They were "on the air," for that room was the first radio studio on the Atlantic seaboard. Old rugs draped and soundproofed the studio walls. A piano was rented and there was a old-fashioned phonograph with a large horn. A few discarded chairs and an old table rounded out the studio set-up, with of course, that new-fangled, all-ears little monster, the microphone. This studio set the style as the country's first and oldest network "flagship" station.

It was on Oct. 1, 1921, to be exact, that a young man named Thomas J. Cowan threw the switch that put WJZ (now WABC), "New York's first station," on the air. And the miracle of radio was received by near and far-away people who had one of those "dangled apparatuses" - an earphone radio set.
WABC (WJZ) was originally built and operated by the Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing company with the transmitter on the roof of its Newark factory. It was only a 500-watt station then. Today, it is 50,000 watts - the largest the Federal Communications Commission allows.
