FIRE FIGHTER

Positions in the City's Fire Service are now available for men 22 through 34 years of age. Men will be selected through a competitive examination which will be held on October 30, 1954.

No experience is required, but candidates must be United States citizens, residents of the City of Bridgeport and qualified electors of the City of Bridgeport, must be mentally alert and mechanically inclined and must meet certain detailed physical standards.

Positions of Fire Fighters pay, as a beginning salary, \$61.94 a week and the maximum pay to which Fire Fighters may be advanced is \$76.52 a week. In addition, the salary rate will be increased by a temporary salary bonus of \$200 a year.


October 14, 1954, is the last day on which men may file applications to compete in this examination. Application forms and announcements of the examination giving all the qualification requirements are available at the office of the
