The voices of some of the most illustrious literary and theatrical talent of the day will be heard tonight from 7 to 8 o'clock when WRCA radio pays tribute to Ernest Hemingway, the writer. The program is timed to coincide with the presentation of the Nobel Prize to the author. The prize was awarded on Dec. 10 for his latest book, "The Old Man and the Sea," and the program will stress the power inherent in the man and his writings.

Leland Hayward, Broadway producer, who is now at work translating the prize-winning novel to movie scenario form, will discuss Hemingway's work as screen material.

Gary Cooper and Ingrid Bergman will be heard in scenes from his "For Whom the Bell Tolls."

Mickey Spillane will discuss a mystery writer's reactions to Hemingway and Leonard Lyons, New York columnist, will tell anecdotes about the author.

Max Eastman, author and critic, will tell the story of Hemingway's reaction to his derisive comment that Hemingway sported "synthetic hair" on his chest. And Al Capp, creator of the cartoon, "L.L. Bean," will discuss Hemingway's preoccupation with the primitive.

ELEANOR STEBER ON SIMULCAST

Lovely Metropolitan Opera soprano Eleanor Steber will be the guest soloist when "The Voice of Firestone" is simulcast over the ABC television and radio networks Monday, from 8:30 to 9 p. m.

Two stories in "Time" and one in "Newsweek" about Miss Steber were indicative of the international interest and excitement aroused by her fabulous successes in Europe this summer. The brilliant, glamorous soprano returned to the U. S. to rejoin the Metropolitan Opera and fill a heavy schedule of concert engagements.

One of the most successful and distinguished discoveries of ABC's "Metropolitan Auditions of the Air," Miss Steber will sing for her "Voice of Firestone" appearance a program in keeping with Christmas, including "Toyland" from Victor Herbert's "Babes in Toyland."

With the chorus, she will sing "The Sleigh," by Kuntz, and "Silent Night," by Gruber. She will also sing Irving Berlin's "White Christmas" and a group of three Christmas carols—"We Wish You a Merry Christmas," "Deck the Halls," and "The First Noel"—the latter two accompanied by the chorus.
