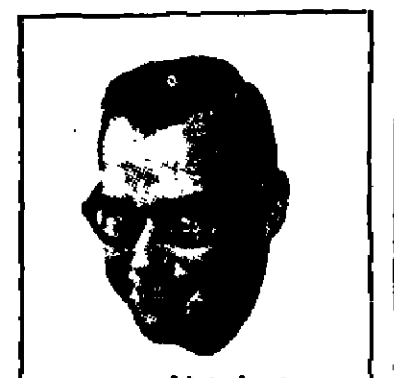


I. F. LUZ TO ADDRESS TALK-IT-OVER CLUB

GEN. SOMERVELL DIES; LED ARMY SERVICE FORCES

OCALA, Fla., Feb. 13 - (AP) Gen. Brehon B. Somervell, 62, commander of the Army Service Forces in World War II died of a heart attack today while chatting with his wife at their Florida home.

The retired four-star general, head of Koppers Co. Inc., at Pittsburgh, Pa., was here recuperating from two surgical operations in 1954.

Mrs. Somervell said he collapsed after showing her a cartoon he tore from the morning paper and asking her to get him something to drink. She called a doctor who lives next door but the general was dead before medical aid could be given.

Friends said he appeared to be making good progress toward recovery and had planned to resume next month his duties as president and chairman of the board of Koppers, a manufacturer of industrial machinery and industrial by-products.

Somervell, who retired from the Army in 1944, will be buried in Arlington National cemetery. Funeral arrangements are incomplete.

Stepdaughter in Riverside Surviving besides the widow are three daughters by an earlier marriage, Mrs. William S. Brenza, Miami; Mrs. John W. Griswold, Paris, France; and Mrs. E. M. Matter, Erie, Pa. He has three step-daughters, Mrs. Harry P. Van Lear Jr., Mrs. Albert G. Walden, both of Ocala, and Mrs. Swager Sherley, Riverside, Conn.

Somervell, born in Little Rock, Ark., was graduated from West Point as second lieutenant in 1914. His experience with the Army Engineers landed him a variety of other assignments in and out of government.

He headed the WPA in New York City from 1938 to 1940, a period in which LaGuardia Airport, many roads, parks and playgrounds were constructed. Before 1925, he assisted in a navigation survey of the Rhine and Danube rivers in Europe for the League of Nations. Walter D. Hines, director of railways in World War I who chose Somervell as his aide for that project, tapped the Army officer again in 1933 for a survey in Turkey.

Hines had been asked by Kemal Ataturk to make a broad study in preparation for an industrialization plan. Somervell completed the job after Hines died and filed a seven-volume report.

In the early 30s Somervell was head of projects operations for the National Emergency council. Dark with the Army, he jumped from lieutenant colonel to lieutenant general in little more than a year and became head of the Army branch first known as Services of Supply, later the Army Service Forces. His job was to supervise service operations, such as those conducted by the Quartermaster Corps, and thus supply of the entire Army.

PRELATE HAILED BY TOURING NIXON GUATEMALA, Feb. 13 - (AP) U. S. Vice President Richard Nixon praised Guatemala's Roman Catholic archbishop today for a "significant contribution to Christianity" because he "asked our Father for help in freeing the people of Guatemala from the deceptions of communism."

Archbishop Mariano Rossell Atitlan reported: "No particular merit is due to my simple person. We are here to serve God and as Father of us all. He gave our people strength to remain faithful and helped those who had been deceived." Archliano was regarded as a strong figure in a 30-year struggle against communism in this Central American republic. He had influenced his nation since the President Jacobo Arbenz Guzman was ousted in a revolution last June. Nixon, on a Caribbean good will tour, saw the archbishop in his private offices in the great cathedral forming one side of the presidential plaza in downtown Guatemala. Heavy Holland, assistant secretary of state who is accompanying Nixon, acted as an interpreter. A microphone carried the words to reporters and others present. Before entering the cathedral, Nixon paused to shake hands with bare-foot women and children who stood outside the door. Some women selling candy handed him presents and cheered him. Earlier, Nixon placed wreaths on a monument to Guatemala's independence heroes and warmly greeted Rodolfo Gonzalez, a ragged 12-year-old shoeless boy who, on Nixon's arrival yesterday, walked a mile alongside his automobile from the airport to the U. S. embassy residence. The vice president also visited Antigua, 25 miles from the capital. Later in the day there was a private interview with President Carlos Castillo Armas and a state dinner at the presidential palace.
