NEW RECORD SET IN PANCAKE RACE

LIBERAL, Kan., Feb. 22—(AP) A 28-year-old Liberal bookkeeper turned in a record-breaking performance today in keeping the international pancake racing title in the United States. Mrs. Blanche Dick scurried over the 4 1/2-yard S-shaped course here in one minute 5.1 seconds to better by 13.4 seconds the time turned in by Mrs. Doris Millward, winner of a similar race held earlier in the day at Olney, England. It marked the third time in the six years of competition between the women of Liberal and Olney this Kansas town has captured the title. Mrs. Dick, who is employed at a laundry, won the race last year in one minute 7.7 seconds. Her time today topped the previous record of one minute 7.2 seconds set by Mrs. Isabel Dix of Olney in 1953. Mrs. Dick, runner-in, in 3-degree clear weather, finished about 50 yards ahead of Mrs. Nina Jordan. "We did it! We did it!" Mrs. Dick panted after crossing the finish line. "I broke the world's record and I can retire now." Mrs. Dick now has won the Liberal leg of the Shrove Tuesday race three times. Under rules of the contest, she is not eligible for further competition. She was dressed in the same outfit she wore last year—a white blouse with 48 blue stars and a skirt with red and white stripes.

UB GROUP ATTENDS HARTFORD SESSION Eighteen University of Bridgeport students will leave tomorrow to attend the annual three-day session of the Connecticut Intercollegiate Student Legislature in Hartford. Seventeen Connecticut colleges and universities will be represented in the affair. Two of the students, Edmund Ramos, Stamford, and Rosemarie Verilli, Stamford, will present bills before the student legislature. Legislation originated by the students goes through various committees, as in the regular state legislature, and comes up for discussion on the House and Senate floor. Ramos has introduced a bill which would extend G. I. bonus benefits to returning veterans in the state whether or not they were in the Korean conflict. Miss Verilli's proposed legislation would place teachers under state-wide civil service regulations. Peter Balino, senior UB delegate, is one of three candidates for the position of speaker in the House of Representatives. Opposing him are candidates from Yale University and St. Joseph's college. Junior delegate is Frederick J. Fiorelli, 351 Johnson Ave., who will argue on the motor vehicle committee.
