

BROTHERS FREED IN NURSE'S DEATH

STAMFORD, March 15 — (AP) Two Stamford brothers, Angelo J. Ferrino, 45, and John, 47, gained their freedom today after having been held in connection with the fatal beating of a nurse near here some two years ago.

City Attorney Joseph J. DeVita said he has dismissed the warrants issued against the Ferrinos. Angelo had been charged with the homicide slaying and John with having been an accessory.

The battered body of the nurse, Mrs. Una Beatrice Egan, 37, was found on a lonely section of a Long Island sound beach, near Stamford, on June 16, 1953. The Ferrino brothers had been reported seen with her in a Fort Chester, N. Y., bar hours before the slaying.

The prosecutor's action came within 24 hours after Fairfield County Coroner Edgar W. Kientzmann, in a finding said he lacked sufficient evidence to hold them any longer.

Angelo, who had been held in the Fairfield county jail at Bridgeport since being returned to Connecticut from Canton, O., last Jan. 6, was freed this afternoon. John had been at liberty under \$10,000 bond. The bond against him was dropped, also this afternoon.

DeVita said his decision to dismiss the warrants came after a conversation with State's Attorney Louis W. Willis, in which they concurred on the coroner's finding.

This Sunday Coffee Cake Has Orange-Coconut Filling



SUNDAY MORNING COFFEE CAKE is made with new instant nonfat dry milk.

For a special breakfast or for snack time this filled coffee cake is delicious. Made with dry milk it's one-pound package makes 8 quarters of nonfat milk for a little as 8 cents a quart. The new instant dry milk also comes in a pre-measured package containing 3 foil-lined envelopes, each of which makes 1 quart of nonfat milk. It is therefore rich in milk's important nutrients—protein, calcium and riboflavin.

A friend brought us one for Sunday brunch. Everyone begged for the recipe.

Sunday Morning Coffee Cake (Makes one 9-inch ring) Two cups sifted flour, 1-3 cup instant nonfat dry milk, 3 teaspoons baking powder, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 1-4 cup shortening, 3-4 cup water, 1 tablespoon melted butter or margarine.

Sift together flour, instant nonfat dry milk powder, baking powder and salt into a bowl. Cut in shortening with two knives or pastry blender until mixture resembles coarse corn meal. Add water all at once, stirring only enough to moisten dry ingredients. Turn out onto floured board; knead for 30 seconds.

Roll out into a rectangle about 14-inch thick. Brush with butter or margarine. Spread with orange-coconut filling. Roll dough lengthwise, jelly roll fashion. Seal edges. Place on baking sheet. Join edges to form into a ring. With scissors, cut halfway through dough at 1-inch intervals. Turn each slice on its side to lie flat on pan. Bake in very hot oven (450 degrees F.) about 20-25 minutes or until browned.

Remove from baking sheet immediately; cool on a cork rack. While still hot, spread with frosting.
