

# 1,096 Town Pupils Attend Parochial, Private Schools

## FAIRFIELD

Working in cooperation with the Most Rev. Lawrence J. Shehan, Bishop of Bridgeport, and individual parochial and private schools, the school administration has completed a survey of children from various districts attending parochial and private schools.

A total of 1,096 students in the town were found to be enrolled currently in parochial and private schools. The number of town students in these schools and the public school districts from which they come are as follows:

St. Thomas, 430 pupils, with 134 from Oldfield district, 29 Pequot, nine, Mill Hill, 145, Mill Plain, 59, Greenberg, 45, Greenberg, 20, new Holland Hill school, two, Dwight, one, Lincoln and two, Nathan Hale.

St. Anthony's, 232 pupils, with 20 from Mill Hill, two, Washington, 42, Oldfield, 32, Pequot, eight, Stratfield, 11, Holland Hill, 24, Sherman, 17, McKinley, five, Nathan Hale, six, Dwight, 11, Fairfield Woods, and seven each from Mill Plain and Greenberg.

St. Ann's, 107 pupils, with four from Nathan Hale, 10, McKinley, 11, Fairfield Woods, 21, Holland Hill, two, Stratfield, three, Lincoln and 56, Greenberg.

St. Emery's, 53 pupils, with 10 from Nathan Hale, 12, Holland Hill, one each from Greenberg, Oldfield and Fairfield Woods and two, McKinley.

Church of Assumption, 55 pupils, with 29 from Stratfield, five, Fairfield Woods, and 21, Lincoln.

St. John's school, one from Fairfield Woods.

Sacred Heart, two pupils, with one each from McKinley and Fairfield Woods.

St. Patrick's, five from Lincoln school.

St. Augustine's, 21 pupils, with eight from McKinley, six, Washington, four, Lincoln and three, Stratfield.

St. Michael's, one from Stratfield, St. Stephen's, one from McKinley, St. Charles, one from Stratfield, St. Theresa's, two pupils, with
