WQXR's new 50,000-watt transmitter at Maspeith, L. I., is expected to be ready for operation by late summer, bringing the station's good music programs to a potential million more homes. The transmitter site, located between Queens and Brooklyn, is almost in the exact geographical center of New York city, making WQXR the only 50-KW radio transmitter within the city's limits. Work has been completed on the two 285-foot steel towers, which rise on either side of WQXR's present radiator, and on the extension to the building which will house the new 50-KW Westinghouse transmitter.
