

TURNING THE DIALS

The first of 17 "World Music Festivals" programs to be broadcast this summer on CBS radio will come from the Rotay Danish Festival in Copenhagen this afternoon from 2:30 to 2:55 o'clock.

The broadcast will open with the Danish composer Johann Peter Hartmann's Overture to "Corregio," followed by a "Flute Concerto" by another Danish composer, Carl Nielsen.

The Copenhagen Boys' Choir, conducted by Mogens Woldike, will perform a Bach Motet, and will give what is believed to be the first American broadcast of a Mass by the 28-year-old Danish composer Bernhard Lewkovitch.

Mr. Fasset has prepared a non-musical feature of the program "Interviews" with the children of Denmark and the sounds of their play and school and musical activities.

Warfield toured the continent with the Philadelphia orchestra as part of the American National Theater Academy's international exchange program.

Warfield also has been widely acclaimed in this country as a concert artist, and won laurels in both the U. S. and Europe in the role of Porgy in Gershwin's folk opera, "Porgy and Bess."

Warfield's appearance on the program will be the first program debut in a list of six for the summer. These artists will join the "Telephone Hour" roster: Luben Vichay, bass, on July 11; Isaac Stern, violinist, July 15; Leonard Warren, baritone, July 25; Thomas Yerkman, pianist, Aug. 5; and Jerome Hines, bass, Aug. 15.

For his program Warfield has selected Verdi's dramatic "Credo" from the opera "Otello"; Mendelssohn's "On the Wings of Song," and two traditional songs, the spiritual "Little David, Play on Your Harp" arranged by Burleigh, and "I Bought Me a Cat," arranged by Copland.

Donald Voorhes will conduct the symphonic orchestra in the "Cazards" from "Coppelia" by Delibes, the "Cuban Serenades" from Herbert's "Suits of Serenades" and Rossini's sparkling overture to "La Gazza Ladra."

Three religious groups have been renewed on WQXR and will continue presentation of their weekly services over the station for another year. They are the New York Society for Ethical Culture, Congregation Emanu-El, New York, and the Christian Science Radio Committee of Greater New York.

The New York Ethical Culture group is now in its 20th year on WQXR. The regular Sunday morning meetings of the society on the second, fourth and fifth (when one occurs) Sundays of each month are broadcast from 11:05 to 12 noon.

With the exception of the eight summer meetings, which will be broadcast from the WQXR studios, all other programs will originate from the Meeting House, 43rd street and Central Park West in New York City.

A portion of the Friday evening services direct from Temple Emanu-El, Fifth avenue at 85th street, will continue to be heard over WQXR from 5:30 to 6 o'clock. The 10th year of these broadcasts from Temple Emanu-El will begin July 1 and will continue for another 82 weeks.

The Christian Science Radio Committee of Greater New York will begin its 11th consecutive year on WQXR July 8. The first and third Sunday of each month will be devoted to a Christian Science service, broadcast from 11:04 a. m. to 12 noon, while on the second Saturday of each month an afternoon Christian Science lecture will be broadcast from 3:05 to 4 o'clock.

UN Is Topic

The United Nations: 1945-1955 featuring the highlights of the 10th anniversary session of the UN meeting in San Francisco, will be the subject on "America's Town Meeting of the Air" tonight over WJAB and WABC at 8 o'clock.

Dr. Benjamin M. Brown, former deputy secretary-general of the United States Mission to the UN and now a lecturer and author, and William Fulton, UN correspondent for the Chicago Tribune, will be guests.

Excerpts of important speech during the week of the UN meetings will be heard on the broadcast with the guests discussing the statements. Among those who will be heard are President Eisenhower, former President Truman, John Foster Dulles, Harold Macmillan, British foreign secretary, Henry Cabot Lodge, Jr., V. M. Molotov and V. K. Krishna Menon.

Davis Is Soloist

Ivan Davis, Jr., 22-year-old American pianist, will be soloist for the opening movement of the "Piano Concerto No. 1" by Tchaikovsky, with the Boston Pops orchestra under the direction of Arthur Fiedler tomorrow night at 8:15 o'clock over WJAB radio.

Davis won the 21st biennial Young Artists Auditions of the National Federation of Music Clubs last April. He also has been awarded a Fulbright scholarship for further study in Europe in the fall.

Fiedler will open the program with the "American Salute," an arrangement of "When Johnny Comes Marching Home" by Gilmore-Gould. This will be followed by the colorful "El Salon Mexico," by the American composer Aaron Copland. The program will be concluded with the first movement of the Tchaikovsky Concerto.

NEW TIME

"Way of the World," the daytime drama which presents complete stories running from one to two weeks, will be moved to a new time spot beginning July 4. Formerly on at 10:30 a. m., the program will now be seen Monday through Friday, at 4 p. m., over NBC-TV.

City-Born Singer Shares Stage With Tenor

Mimi Benzell and Robert Rounseville, two of America's most popular young operatic singers, will be guest soloists on "The Voice of Firestone" when it is simulcast over the ABC television and radio networks Monday, 8:30 to 9 p. m. (WJAB and Channel 43 locally).

Miss Benzell, an enchanting young soprano who made her Metropolitan Opera debut in Mozart's "Magic Flute," is one of television's favorite opera singers. Rounseville, favorite tenor of the concert stage, screen and opera, is especially known for his starring role in "Tales of Hoffman."

This is the story of a handful of fishermen at sea under "black" frost conditions—when ice forms so quickly on a vessel that it will capsize or be submerged unless the temperature changes quickly. The skipper is greedy to make a big catch no matter what the hazards but his younger brother is rebellious as well as wroughtup over domestic troubles. One of the sailors is a murderer trying to escape detection but the skipper knows his identity. These explosive emotional elements cause violent action leading to a rousing climax.

SINGING DOG HERO OF DRAMA AT SEA

Bulbul, a nondescript puppy whose name is the Arabic word for nightingale, lives up to that name with wonderful results in "The Nightingale." Playhouse production tonight, 7:30 to 8 p. m., over Channels 7 and 43.

The pooch belongs to the son of a famous violinist who is traveling with his family to France aboard a ship also bearing names of wounded French soldiers from Indo-China. Bulbul's habit of reacting to violin music with high-pitched howls at first gets him into serious trouble but finally makes him a military hero.

Cast includes Bobby Clark as the boy, Jamie, Alf Kjellin as his violinist-father, Geanne Bates as his mother, Bruce Bennett as the ship doctor and Truc Porchot as a nurse.

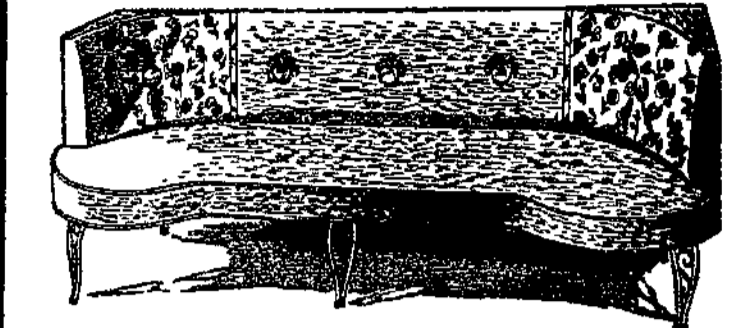
VACATION NOTE

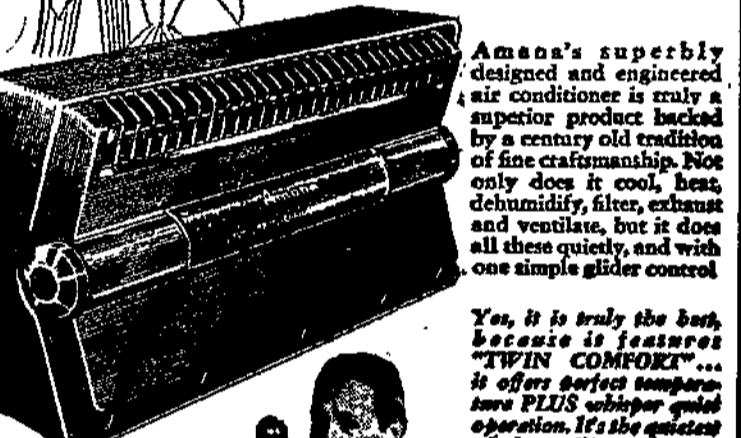
