12 States Enact Laws to Curb Horror, Sex, Crime Comic Books

CHICAGO, July 10—(AP) State legislators this year found little to laugh at in some of the millions of comic books produced annually in the United States.

An Associated Press survey shows 12 states enacted laws to curb comic books depicting horror, sex or violent crimes...

Other states attacked the problem from different angles: Washington's legislature passed a law licensing wholesale and retail comic book dealers...

This law hasn't gone into effect, however, because of a friendly court action brought by a comic book dealer to test its constitutionality.

A legal question also was raised by a bill passed in Texas banning tie-in sales—the practice of dealers to require retailers to take certain comic books in order to get good magazines.

The chief question raised in the discussion of this bill was whether or not it would stand up in court. The legislature decided to pass it and wait and see.

New Jersey also banned tie-in sales in a bill signed into law June 7. So did Oregon.

A bill banning the sale of crime-horror comic books passed the California legislature but Gov. Goodwin Knight Saturday said he would pocket-veto it.

Although newspapers were specifically exempted under the bill, the Allentown Newspaper Publishers Association had attacked the measure as a form of censorship.

Illinois lawmakers adopted a bill prohibiting the sale of publications devoted to crime, sex, violence or immorality to any person under 18.

They also decided to make it a misdemeanor to tie in sales of publications with other printed material that is obscene.

Nevada banned objectionable comic books, but set up no standard to determine which are objectionable and no provisions for enforcement.

HOUSE GROUP TO ACT ON SECURITY BOOSTS

WASHINGTON, July 10—(AP) Rep. John McCormack (D-Mass.) predicted today the Democratic plan for broadening social security coverage will draw "quite a few" Republican votes in the House.

"In fact," added the House Democratic leader in an interview, "I'd be surprised if many of them voted against it." He said the measure is "of importance to countless persons."

The House Ways and Means committee is expected to complete the measure Tuesday, and a vote on the House floor is likely within the next 10 days.

As drafted for final approval, the Democratic plan would (1) lower from 65 to 62 years the age at which workers can draw social security benefits...

To pay for this, the social security tax would be upped one percentage point next Jan. 1—the date the benefits would take effect.

The tax hike would be quickly felt by the 53 million jobholders who pay into the social security fund. But the bill's sponsors count on this being offset by immediate help it would give some 800,000 older women and 500,000 disabled workers.
