

PORTLAND, Maine, July 12—An AFL truck drivers' official said today a \$10,000 breach of contract suit against the union is "entirely without foundation."

The St. Johnsbury Trucking Co. Inc. filed the action in U.S. District Court, claiming Maine union members had broken a "no strike" clause in their contract by stopping work June 24-30 days after the company had been struck in Massachusetts, Rhode Island and Connecticut.

Albert Page, secretary-treasurer of the union's local 549, said the charge "is ridiculous."

"There has been no strike or stoppage of work," he said in a prepared statement. "The men are simply living up to the terms of the contract, which say that they shall not be expected or requested by their employer to go where labor trouble exists."
