JACOBY ON BRIDGE Experts Give Trump Trouble

By OSWALD JACOBY. There wasn't much to the bidding of today's hand because North was an expert. He opened with one no-trump, thus showing a balanced hand with 10 to 13 points.

Even at the low contract of two spades, South had his troubles. This was because he was playing against experts. Perhaps average players would have given South an easier time.

West opened the nine of hearts, and East allowed dummy to hold the first trick. Declarer next led the low club from dummy, and East stepped right up with the ace, capturing the singleton king.

West now returned a low diamond, and South had to make an important decision. Should he put up dummy's king, or should he play low from dummy in the hope that West's lead was from the queen?

The reader will have no trouble in making the right decision, since he can see exactly where the ace and queen of diamonds are. South didn't have this advantage, so he had to work it out by logic.

East had already shown up with two aces, and South thought it was unlikely that East would have passed originally if he had held three aces. For this reason, South decided correctly to play West for the ace of spades.

The rest was, of course, very easy. Declarer cashed a high club to discard the jack of diamonds, took the ace of spades, and gave up a spade, thus making an over-trick.
