Ted Sack, the producer of CBS relevision's religious workshop series, "Look Up and Live," is a husky, intense 32-year-old ex-cavalryman who has had a brisk career in broadcasting. A native of Bridgeport, Sack was signed into a horse cavalry unit at the start of World War II, gravitated to steaming New Guinea 45 a "muleskinner," handed his mules over to the British in India, clambered onto the Burma Road with remnants of

Merrill's Marauders and at the close of hostilities was drilling Chinese troops in the remote heart of Asia. Back in "civvies" and in search of an occupation, Sack teetered around the New York area for a while on the brink of an engineering career. To keep the wolf from the doors Perry's Hour

ne turned a hobby in photography into a vocation, and got his foot in-to broadcasting via the darkroom of CBS's press information depart-When he was not in the dark

room, Sack kept his eyes wide open. worked his way through a host of network jobs (log clerk, schedule clerk, operations clerk) and missed few chances to punch-hit for production personnel in all sorts of emergencies. In August, 1954, he was transferred to News and Publie Affairs as a special events pro-Sack criss-crossed the United States putting on special events

shows, finally got a series assign-ment, producing "An Eye on New York," and last Januarary capped a two-month major research on what US children were watching television-wise by producing the pilot for the "Let's Take a Trip"

Next he was assigned to produce "Look Up and Live" Within three weeks network executives were warming to letters of acclaim from church and industry quarters.

What Sack did to get these results was startling simple. He buttonholed scores of youngsters in Fairfield county and New Jersey, got from them the view that the religious program they would watch would simply have to advertize the things which young persons were interested in, and in following weeks was able to chart a series of programs that contained the vanted elements.
