Albert McCleery, executive producer of NBC-TV's "Matinee Theater," has scheduled the first five weeks' productions of the new series of full-hour live dramatic programs to be presented on Channel 4 in color and black and white starting tomorrow afternoon at 3 o'clock and to be seen in the future Monday through Friday at that time. In addition, McCleery has obtained the television rights to 86 more properties, making a total of 110 shows available before the premier of the daily drama presentations.

Though this number represents about five months of programming for "Matinee Theater," it is the equivalent of more than a two-year script supply for such year-round weekly dramatic shows as "Television Theater," "Robert Montgomry Presents" or "Television Playhouse."

Of the 110 properties for the program, the majority include original teleplays and adaptations of stories, movies and Broadway novels, shows, and the rest consist of live repeat programs from nighttime dramatic shows of such calibre as "Television Theater," "Television Playhouse," "Sudio One," "Robert Montgomery Presents," "Motorola," U. S. Steel Hour 'and others.

The list of top-rated and established television dramatic writers whose works are already contracted for include David Davidson, Tod Serling, Gore Vidal, Howard Rodnan, Nicholts Baehr, Sumner Locke Eliot, Robert J. Shaw, Frank Gilroy, N. Richard Nash, Robert Howard Lindsay, Kathleen Lindsay and Joseph Liss.

Among the literary figures whose works will be adapted for the program are such greats as J. Marquand, Henry James, Edith Wharton, T. S. Eliot, Emily Bronte, Sinclair Lewis, Feodor Dostoevski James Thurber and Samon Raphaelson. Popular novelists and magazine vriters whose properties will be dramatized include Frances Parkinson Keyes, Gladys Schmitt, John Secondari, Margaret Culkin Banning, Margaret Cousins, Nancy Hale, Maze de le Roche and Thyra Samter Winslow.

The plays scheduled for the intial week are: Monday, "Beginning Now," by John P. Marquand; Tuesday, "Make Believe Mother," by Ricky Surer; Wednesday, "The Persistent Image." by Gladys Schmitt: Thursday, "I'm Straight with the World," by Theodore Apstein; and Friday, "Progress Jr., and Minnie Sweeney" by Ed Kellso.

As far as the three continents go, Diane was born in Queensland, Australia: studied and acted in England and is now on the crest of her stage success in America.
