WQXR has commissioner the well-known music authority Herbert Weinstock to write and broadcast a series of 26 programs dealing with the entire musical career of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart.

In the writing field, he is executive editor of Alfred A. Knopf, Inc., and is co-author with Wallace Brockway of "Men and Music: Their Lives, Times and Achievements," a well-known and continuously popular book.

The first program on the WQXR Mozart Bicentennial celebration will be heard Saturday, Jan. 7, just three weeks prior to the actual 200th anniversary of the composer's birth, Jan. 7, 1756.

Picking and selecting from the wealth of material at hand, Weinstock has planned 26 programs which will cover the unequalled range of Mozart's composition, exploring the vast field of Mozart's life and works in an authoritative yet informal manner.

Telecast TOPICS

WEATHERMAN SAYS
COLD SPELL COMING
WASHINGTON, Dec. 17.—(UP)—It will be colder than normal over most of the country between now and Jan. 15, the Weather bureau forecast today. But the southwest will have higher than normal temperatures and thermometers along the gulf coast and in Northern New England will register normal reading, the bureau's 30-day forecast said. Greater than normal amounts of snow were forecast for the northern third of the nation from the Great Lakes westward to the Pacific Coast. Rainfall is expected to be above normal along the West Coast and below normal in the east. Snowfall, precipitation is indicated in the southern half of the country, with a hard along the Gulf Coast.
