

TURNING THE DIALS

Club women from Connecticut will be present at Alma Dettinger's broadcast of "Other People's Business" in the WQXR auditorium on Wednesday afternoon to hear a talk on activities at the United Nations and a reference to the work of their own service bureau. The program will be heard over WQXR from 2:30 to 3 p.m.

The speakers will be Thomas J.

Hamilton, chief of the UN bureau of the New York Times; Miss Chase Goring Woodhouse, former congresswoman from Connecticut who is director of the Service Bureau for Women's Organizations; and Mrs. Beatrice Fox Aderbach, head of the foundation bearing her name which supports the service bureaus.

In interviews with the two women, Miss Dettinger will have them explain their unique service bureaus clearing house for Connecticut women's clubs in their search for information in developing programs. In one year alone, the bureau has handled more than 800 inquiries from Connecticut club representatives and their organizations. The concentration has been in the fields of welfare, education, international relations, and techniques of club work.

Mr. Hamilton's appearance on the program in a discussion of UN affairs with the club women present in the audience is a part of the international relations program recommended by the service bureaus.

Holy Hour

COYOTES DRY OUT

MANHATTAN, Kan., Feb. 4 (AP) — Kansas' protracted drought is proving a bane not only for the Wheat State's farmers, but also for the furbearers' foes, the coyotes. H. T. Gier, Kansas State College zoologist, reports the state's coyote population has dropped from 70,000 to less than 40,000 in the past few years. Gier says dry summers have reduced cover, thereby making coyotes more vulnerable to hunters.
