# TOLL REACHES 147 IN EUROPE'S COLD as thaw sets in

LONDON, Feb. 5 (AP)-The great thaw set in today over much of shivering Europe but the tail end of the country's worst cold wave brought continuing hardship to millions of families.

The known death toll climbed to 147 on the sixth day of the now subsiding Siberian blasts which wreaked millions of dollars in damage across Europe, even down to the sunny Mediterranean.

The deep freeze persisted in France and Italy. Moscow reported sinking sub-zero temperatures and primary school children there were warned to stay home.

### Plumbers Benefit

In thawing Britain the loud noise was the drip, drip, drip of water seeping from burst frozen pipes in-to thousands of homes. Only the plumbers seemed to be benefiting from temperature readings which soared into the upper 40s during the day.

Deaths attributed in one way or another to the weather were counted as follows: France 42, Britain 36, Italy 20, Denmark 11, Germany 10, Turkey 10, Austria 5, Holland 4, Switzerland 4, Yugoslavia 2, Spain 2 and Belgium 1.

Temperatures in northern Germany were rising but still around freezing point. In the south, it was snowing. Scores of families at Vilshofen in Bavaria remained homeless after an ice jam on the Danube caused an overflow that inundated 250 homes. American and German rescue crews were trying to reach cut-off homes as the water receded

### Swedes See Sun

In Sweden, Stockholm enjoyed a brief look at a bright sun shortly after noon. Snow continued to fall on the northern half of the country and the mercury dropped to 10 be low. The Weather Service warned Swedes to brace for cold weather for at least another few days. The ice-jam in Denmark's waters began to ease as temperatures rose to around the freezing point, In Greece, blizzards foiled at-

NEW DELHI, India, Feb. 5 (AP) -Billy Graham's tour of India was described today as successful in stirring new religious interest among Christians in this largely Hindu country. This view was expressed by In-

dian and foreign church leaders, diplomats and other observers, regarless of whether they agree or not with his message, Graham has com-pleted the third week of his visit. Graham, holding his second public meeting in New Delhi today,

drew about 15,000 to the lawns of the local YMCA, where he delivered his plea for rededication to Film Christ. Graham told his audiencewhich included many Americans and some diplomats—that he came to India "to learn something, Indian history shows you are sensitive to spiritual movements and answers to the world's problems is spiritual and not material."

the stock for more than six months before you sold it, your profit is a "long-term capital gain," This means that only half of your profit s counted as taxable income—and the other half is entirely tax-free. The rate of tax on the taxable half can't go up higher than 50 per cent, even though your income is big enough to push you over that rate bracket.

QUESTION: I received and sold ome American Telephone and Telegraph company rights in 1955. Are hese taxable?

ANSWER: Yes, but as a capital gain and not as fully taxable ordinary income. You will be considered to have held the rights from the time you first bought the original stock on which the rights were issued. Thus, if you had already held the stock for more than six months, you can treat the profit on the rights as a long-term capital gain even though you sold the rights immediately after you received them. This is important because as a longterm capital gain only half you: profit is taxable.
