Red Cross Disturbed As Public Response Lags In Blood Drive

Stratford Apathy of the townspeople toward the Red Cross mobile blood program has Red Cross officials worried, Frank A. Larkin, chairman, says. "This blood is so necessary," said Mr. Larkin, "yet we seem unable to convince the general public without offering special prizes or some extra inducement that they should support the program. If it was not for our industrial plants we would never meet the quotas." Mr. Larkin pointed out that the visit of the mobile unit last week produced 104 pints of blood when 150 were necessary. The record showed that 64 persons who had pledged blood failed to put in an appearance. The drive through use of circulars in the schools proved more disappointing than any type of idea used to date, the chairman said. Although more than 9,000 letters were sent to the homes with a plea for housewives to contribute a pint of blood only 19 mothers responded to the call. "We reached the 100 mark last week," asserted Mrs. Larkin only because Mrs. Nelson Cary, Mrs. Laurie Albren, Mrs. Eleanor Bell, Mrs. Corlane Driscoll and Mrs. Louise Matosko, volunteer workers at the blood bank gave blood, in addition to their time and services.
