

Met to Offer Additional Series from Boston

For opera lovers there is good news in today's announcement that three additional Metropolitan performances are to be presented through WIBA on Saturday afternoon, beginning with tomorrow's Boston performance of "Das Rheingold."

The New York season closed last Saturday, simultaneously with the concluding broadcast of the series. However, the Metropolitan company is making a series of appearances in Boston, and these will be heard on WIBA.

On succeeding Saturday afternoons WIBA listeners will hear "Cavalleria Rusticana" and Humperdinck's "Hansel and Gretel," and then Bizet's "Carmen."

"Das Rheingold" introductory work of the mighty Wagnerian "Ring Des Niebelungen," with Friederich Schott as Wotan, will begin on WIBA Saturday at 12:50. Others in the cast will be Rene Maison, Édouard Habich, Hans Clemens, Doris Doe, Karin Branzeli, Emanuel List and Norman Cordon.
