

# Roosevelt, Wallace Talk on Land Grant Broadcast

President Roosevelt will be the principal speaker during a broadcast from Washington's birthplace, Mount Vernon, Va., at 11:30 a. m. Wednesday through WIBA, WMAQ. His address will be heard during the Land Grant college program, on the National Farm and Home hour. Other speakers will be Agriculture Sec. Wallace and Harry Brown, assistant secretary of agriculture.
