

100th Anniversary Marked; Burns in Radio Theater

On the first anniversary of the most devastating floods in American history, Admiral Cary T. Grayson, chairman of the American Red Cross; Frank R. McNinch, chairman of the federal communications commission, and Neville Miller, former mayor of Louisville, will address the audiences of the combined NBC-Red and Columbia networks in a special flood relief memorial program from 11 to 11:30 tonight.

Grayson and McNinch will speak from Washington, D. C., while Miller will be heard from New York. A special musical program from Louisville, heart of the flooded areas, also will be a feature of the memorial broadcast, which will be heard through WMAQ.
