Huston on Powell Show

The St. Ann's Episcopal Church choir of Chicago, which is made up entirely of Boy Scouts and Cubs, will be heard during a special broadcast commemorating the 20th anniversary of the Boy Scouts of America at 8:30 tonight on WENR.
