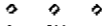


Programs

Easter Be Aired on Networks

Pope Pius XI's annual Easter benediction will be heard throughout the United States over NBC and CBS stations April 17 from 5 to approximately 5:30 a. m. A translation of His Holiness' message will be broadcast immediately after the talk or during its pauses.

Easter music by the choir of the Sistine chapel and the Benedictine choir will be heard from the Vatican. His Holiness will speak from the Vatican. This will be his third Easter benediction broadcast. He talked last Easter Sunday and in 1935.

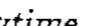
