

# McCarthy and Bergen; Cabinet Break

Charlie McCarthy and Edgar Bergen will be at the microphone during a special program through NBC-WIBA at 7 tonight when the National Broadcasting co. gives a preview radio salute to the projected arrival of Crown Prince Gustav and Princess Louise of Sweden in this country on June 28, for an extended stay in Pennsylvania. The royal couple will be repaying a visit which Gov. Earle of Pennsylvania made to Sweden last summer.

Charlie and his master probably will have with them Mrs. Nellie Bergen, Bergen's mother.

The program will commemorate the 300th anniversary of the New Sweden on the Delaware, and the Swedish tercentenary program will feature a special pick-up from Washington, D. C., for a brief address by Wollmar Bestrom, Swedish ambassador to this country.

Other features of the program, including the salute of McCarthy and Bergen, will originate in the NBC Hollywood studios.
