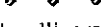
BBM Friday

The impressive ceremonies attendant to the unveiling of a memorial to the Australian war dead, with addresses by King George VI of England and Pres. Albert Lebrun of France, will be broadcast at 6:30 a. m. Friday through WIBA and WBBM.

The occasion will mark the first time in many months that King George has been heard by American listeners, and it is believed to be the first time that Pres. Lebrun has spoken over the radio to America.

The monument has been erected at Villers Bretonneaux, France. King George will unveil the memorial in the presence of Queen Elizabeth, Pres. Lebrun and other notables.

One of the highlights of the broadcast will be the singing of a verse from the British national anthem by a chorus of 240 boys from the school in Villers which was built with funds provided by the people of Australia for restoration of the village after the war.
