## Musical

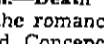

7 p. m.—**Waltz Time (WMAQ)**: another popular musical show featuring the music of Abe Lyman and the singing of Frank Munn.

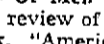

## Drama

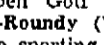

6 p. m.—**"Of Men and Books" (WBBM)**: a review of Harold Sinclair's book, "American Years."

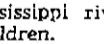
