9:15 p. m. — Vocal Variety (WIBA): highlight attraction is the "Minuet in Jazz".

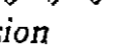

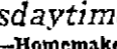
5:45 p. m.—"Don't You Believe It" (WGN): another new program which proves that some popular beliefs are false.
