

Kostelanetz Self Play Pia 6,000 Miles

Andre Kostelanetz will sit in a comfortable chair in Buenos Aires and hear himself play the piano—6,000 miles away!

One of the most unusual broadcasts on record is scheduled for today, when Kostelanetz, now touring South America, will broadcast a special concert over the coast-to-coast facilities of the Columbia network, after which CBS will rebroadcast the recording of the concert for the South American audience.

During the concert, which will be heard in the United States at 3 p. m., Kostelanetz will make one of his infrequent solo appearances by playing his own composition, "Lake Louise," from "Canadian Impressions."

As the concert progresses, Transcriptions, Inc. will make a recording and arrange to shortwave the broadcast of the record back to South America. This arrangement was made at the request of Kostelanetz, who is anxious to compare the musical quality of the numbers as they sound in the studio, and coming back by shortwave.
