6:30 p. m. — Tommy Dorsey (WMAQ): four new songs from Deanna Durbin's new picture will be heard.

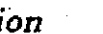
7:30 p. m. — Paul Whiteman (WBBM): Walter Gross, pianist, returns for another performance.

6 p. m. — People's Platform (WBBM): the question is "Can We Spend Our Way to Recovery?"

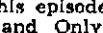


### Variety

7 p. m. — Town Hall (WIBA): the game hunt has Col. Lemuel Stoopnagle as permanent wizard.

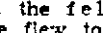
7:30 p. m. — For Men Only (WMAQ): tonight's guests are Johnny Vander Meer and Commander Charles E. Rosendahl.

8 p. m. — It Can Be Done (WBBM): Connie Mack tells just how he does it in the game of baseball.



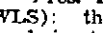
### Drama
