Armstrong Music Camp Air Tonight

Tonight's boxing bout between Lou Ambers and Henry Armstrong will be broadcast at 8 through WENR.

The radio premiere of the new "Passacaglia" by Clark Kessler of the Chicago Symphony orchestra and a dramatic review of a Century of Progress in American school music will feature the National Music camp concert to be broadcast from Interlochen, Mich., from 7 to 8 tonight over the NBC-Blue network. The first half hour will be broadcast by WLS and the second by WIBA and WENR.

Gus Fraser Harrison, director of the Rochester Civic orchestra, and Glen Bainum, director of bonds at Northwestern university, will be guest conductors of the National High School orchestra and the National High School band, respectively.

Under the baton of Harrison, the orchestra will play Beethoven's "Leonore" overture, No. 3; Grieg's lyrical "Heartwounds." This last selection has been played in concert by the University of Chicago orchestra, but will be heard for the first time on the air during this broadcast.

The band will contribute "Procession of the Nobles" by Rimsky-Korsakow, three "Sea Pieces" by MacDowell, Agostini's dramatic "Three Trumpeteers" and the "Crown Imperial March" by Walton.

Growth of the United States into one of the most musical nations in the world, with a rapidly increasing army of symphony players, choruses, bands and other musical organizations, will be dramatized in the intermission period by members of the music camp's radio workshop.
