

Programs Others Birthday Security Act

President Roosevelt will be the principal speaker during a special program in connection with the third anniversary of the signing of the social security act, from 8:30 to 8:45 tonight over WENR, WGN, and WBBM. Mr. Roosevelt is expected to speak from his home in Hyde park, N. Y.

Brief addresses by Sen. Robert F. Wagner (D., N. Y.), and by Arthur J. Altmeyer, chairman of the social security board, will be heard from the Shoreham hotel, Washington, D. C., where a dinner in celebration of the anniversary will be in progress.

A Madison program in observance of the anniversary will be presented from the studios of WIBA at 8:05, under the direction of Sydney S. Miller, divisional manager. Participants will be Prof. E. E. Witte, now serving on the federal social security advisory council; George Keith, supervisor of the state pension department; Dr. Carl N.
