**6:30 p. m.—Grant Park Popular concert (WJJD):** Orrin Tucker and his orchestra play a half-hour of "swing" before the main attraction.

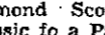

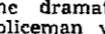
**8:30 p. m.—The Northerners (WGN):** the male octet sings selection from the motion picture, "Alexander Ragtime Band."

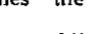


### Drama
