6:30 p. m.—Paul Whiteman (WBBM): seven nursery rhymes linked together.

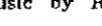
7 p. m.—Town Hall (WIBA, WMAQ): Stoopnagle picks on the commentators.

7:30 p. m.—Minstrels (WENR): Bing Crosby tunes.

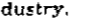
8:30 p. m.—It Can Be Done (WBBM): Maj. Alexander P. de Seversky, war hero and airplane designer, tells how.
