A series of observances of the 150th anniversary of the ratification of the United States Constitution by New York State will be broadcast tonight and Saturday-time by all three major networks.

The chief speaker to be heard during the observance will be Pres. Roosevelt who will give the main address on the exact site of the courthouse, where, in 1788, the constitution was formally accepted. He will be heard from Poughkeepsie, N. Y., Saturday morning at 8:30 through stations WBBM, WMAQ, WLS, WIBA, and WTMJ.

A Constitution day program from Hollywood tonight will be broadcast at 8:15. Filmsters Jeanette MacDonald, Eddie Cantor and Garry Cooper will be heard through station WBBM.
