

Roosevelt to Launch National CU Drive in Broadcast Tonight

President Roosevelt will inaugurate the 1938 Community Mobilization for Human Needs in a broadcast at 9 tonight through WENR, WBBM, and other stations.

The program, celebrating the 25th anniversary of the Community Chest movement in the United States, also will include a talk by Charles P. Taft, 1938 chairman, and music by the Cincinnati Symphony orchestra, conducted by Jose Iturbi.

The concert will include "Les Fetes," Debussy; prelude to third act, "Lohengrin," Wagner, and "Finlandia," Sibelius.
