

Directs NBC Orchestra Concert Tonight

The NBC Symphony orchestra, under the direction of Arturo Toscanini, will resume its weekly concerts tonight with a broadcast from 9 to 10:30 through WIBA-WMAQ.

Toscanini will inaugurate his second season with Vaughn Williams' "Fantasia on a Theme by Thomas Tallis" for double string orchestra; Brahms' third symphony; Martucci's "Notturmo" and "Novelletta", and Tschaiikowsky's overture-fantasy, "Romeo and Juliet."

"When the conductor resumed rehearsals in Radio City this week, he found 74 veterans and 24 new members in his orchestra. Mischa Mischakoff returned as concertmaster and Henri Nosco Remo Bolognini as the maestro's assistants.

Among the new men are Violinist Alfred Lustgarten, 25-year-old brother of Edgar Lustgarten, 22-year-old cellist in the orchestra; the three Berv brothers, French horn artists from the Philadelphia orchestra; Trumpeter Donald Bryan, formerly with Fred Waring, and Sam Lewis, who formerly played trombone with Paul Whiteman.
