

# Programs 11 20 Years to the War End

Radio will observe Armistice day Friday with several programs in tribute to the men who died 20 years ago "that peace might live."

On Station WIBA will be heard the American Legion broadcast from Arlington, a special tribute with a message from the immortal writings of Abraham Lincoln, an interview with a World war hero, and a special service from the National Cathedral in Washington.

Regularly scheduled programs on WIBA and other stations also will salute this "day of remembrance."

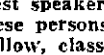
On WIBA at 10:45 a. m. Friday will be heard a program recalling the first clamorous expression of joy at the signing of the Armistice 20 years ago, and the silent solemn prayer for continued peace.

At the tomb of the Unknown Soldier services will be held and broadcast at 11 a. m., through WENR and over WIBA at 11:30. The Rev. Jerome L. Fritsche, national chaplain of the American Legion, will open the service with the invocation. Brig. Gen. Frank T. Hines, administrator of veterans affairs, will follow. The musical portion will be furnished by the United States Army band and Mario Cozzi as soloist.

Significance of Armistice day in the light of recent world events will be discussed by Bishop James E. Freeman in a special service from the National Cathedral, and over WIBA at 2 p. m. Friday.

The program will be a memorial to Woodrow Wilson and will be presented under the auspices of the Woodrow Wilson Armistice day committee.

John Barclay, World war hero of Merriam, Kan., will relate some of his experiences "over there" during the Farm Radio news program, over WIBA at 12:15 Friday noon.

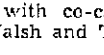

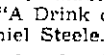

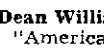
