

# Two Football Games, Opera 'Otello' Receive Air Spotlight Saturday

Two football games and a broadcast from the stage of the Metropolitan Opera house in New York city will headline Saturday's radio offerings.

The "Met" production, to be aired at 12:55 p. m. through WIBA and WMAQ, will be Verdi's "Otello," with Giovanni Martinelli, Lawrence Tibbett, and Maria Caniglia heading the cast.

The Mississippi-Tennessee football game will be broadcast at 1:45 p. m. through WBBM, with John Harrington at the microphone. The Notre Dame-Southern California game will be put on the air at 3:45 p. m. by WBBM and WENR and by WIBA and WGN at 4.

In addition, WIBA will carry the big broadcast rally tonight at 11 originating in Los Angeles on the eve of the Irish-Trojan game. Noted comedians will act as cheer leaders for Southern California and Notre Dame, the Trojan band and glee club will offer songs of both schools. Pres. Von Kleinsmid of California will speak briefly, and the coaches of both teams—Elmer Layden and Howard Jones—will be heard.
