

Rodzinski Conducts Symphony Orchestra on Program

The NBC symphony orchestra will be conducted by Artur Rodzinski, leader of the Cleveland orchestra, for the next four concerts starting tonight. He will replace Toscanini, who will return Jan. 7, 1939. An all Russian program will be heard tonight through stations WIBA and WMAQ at 9.
