

Cary Grant Has Mysterious Title In New Show Sunday

"The Circle" Will Have Premiere At 10 P. M.;
Musical Extravaganza Scheduled Over
WABC At 7:30 P. M.

Cary Grant bears the mysterious title of "Beadle" in "The Circle," new show which has its premiere Sunday, over WEAJ at 10 p. m. "The Circle" is a club which includes Ronald Colman, Carole Lombard, Grant, Lawrence Tibbett, the Marx Brothers (Groucho and Chico), and Robert Emmett Dolan—Grant being the Beadle of "The Circle."

According to a dictionary (believed to be reliable but not guaranteed) a beadle can be an official who keeps order in church; the apparitor of a university such as Oxford and formerly at Yale; a crier at court; the apparitor of a guild; or a herald.

Following in the path of its successful previous program of the new "Screen Guild Show," the second of the series will star Fred Astaire, Herbert Marshall, Frankie Pangborn and Loretta Young in a musical extravaganza over WABC Sunday, at 7:30 p. m.

Astaire will be heard as the dancing-singing orchestra leader in the gay musical comedy that takes place in sophisticated Manhattan. It will introduce a new song, "Only When You're In My Arms" which is featured in his new film, "The Castles." Miss Young will be heard as the "owner of his affections," while Marshall is the "other man." Pangborn has a 1933 comedy part.

Titled "Mrs. Brown of Worcester," the gay musical was written by Dwight Taylor from an idea by Arthur Sheekman. Following the program's idea of having writers to match the talents of the stars, Taylor was responsible for two of Astaire's greatest film successes, "The Gay Divorcee" and "Top Hat."
