

# "War For Sale" Scheduled For Playhouse Hour Sunday

Drama Based On Life Of Alfred Nobel To Be  
Heard At 9 P. M.; Nelson Eddy Set For  
Final Winter Broadcast

"War For Sale," a radio play based on the life of Alfred Nobel, will be presented on the Hollywood Playhouse program over WJZ Sunday, at 9:00 p. m., with Frances Dee playing opposite Tyrone Power. It will be a return engagement to the Playhouse for Miss Dee.

The theme of the play is Nobel's dream of world peace, altho the great Swedish scientist and founder of the Nobel Prizes was the inventor of dynamite. Power plays the role of Nobel and Miss Dee that of Ineborg, a country-bred lass who brought temporary peace to the stormy heart of Nobel.

Nobel died in 1896, bequeathing a fund of \$9,000,000 for prizes in recognition of outstanding accomplishment in the arts, the sciences, and the cause of world peace.

Nelson Eddy's final broadcast of the winter season on the Charlie McCarthy program will be heard over WEAJ Sunday, at 8:00 p. m., after which Donald Dickson, Metropolitan Opera baritone, will take over until Eddy's return in the late summer or early fall. Eddy will take his annual vacation and begin an extended concert tour.

Maryleen O'Sullivan, popular

screen actress, will be the program's guest, playing opposite Don Ameche in an original one-act radio drama and then in a role for which Charlie McCarthy has cast her in another of his own original plays.

Besides the songs of Nelson Eddy, which will be listeners' favorites of the last six months, Dorothy Lamour and Don Ameche will sing with Robert Armbruster's orchestra.

Noel Coward, playwright, actor, composer and producer, will be inducted into The Circle, new all-star show, at the broadcast meeting of Sunday, as the second new member since the unique "club"
