

Brilliant Stars In Cast Of Radio Theatre's Offering

Lionel Barrymore, Edward Arnold And Peter Holden To Do "The Return Of Peter Grimm"

A play of which Cecil B. DeMille was co-author with David Belasco will be presented in the Radio Theatre Monday, with Lionel Barrymore, Edward Arnold and Peter Holden in the leading parts. The play is "The Return of Peter Grimm," and the radio adaptation of the original Belasco-DeMille play will be heard over WABC at 9 p. m. with DeMille as usual producing.

This play, which enjoyed great success on Broadway and in the movies, was a product of the days before DeMille became associated with the movies, when both he and his father worked with Belasco in New York.

Lionel Barrymore plays the Peter Grimm of the title and Peter Holden is the boy William, a role very similar to the one in which he made such a hit on Broadway last year — in "On Borrowed Time."

Inspired by the fact that February brings with it the birthdays of Washington and Lincoln, Al Pearce and his Gang will delve into the past to present their hysterical version of "Historical Night" in their program Monday from 8 to 8:30 p. m. over WEAJ. Carl Hoff, doing his own share of turning back the pages, will offer a super-doooper swing arrangement of that piano beginner's favorite "Chopsticks," as the musical feature of the program. And when the Hoff-tempo boys start giving out, it's safe to predict that you'll never recognize the old two-finger tune. Hoff and the orchestra will also present other more recently popular selections.

Richard Crooks will return to New York from his concert tour to sing with the Firestone Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Alfred Wallenstein, on the Voice of Firestone program Monday. He will be heard over WEAJ at 8:39 p. m. The Metropolitan Opera tenor will sing on the Firestone program again on Feb. 20, after which he will not be heard again until March 27, when he will be presented from San Francisco. Margaret Speaks, the program's soprano star, will be the soloist in the other February and March broadcasts.

On Monday Crooks will sing Balfe's "Killarney," Foster's "Beautiful Dreamer," Strauss' "Morgen" and Sullivan's "The Lost Cord." The orchestra also will be heard in Elgar's "Pomp and Circumstance," Gounod's "Faust Waltz" and Turina's "Danza Fantastica No. 3."

Music by celebrated Viennese composers will be presented by Marek Weber and his orchestra, with Opal Craven and the Continental Quartet, during the program Monday at 10:00 p. m., over WEAJ. Miss Craven will sing Brahms' "Wiegenlied," and the quartet will be heard in a medley of "Ja Ja Der Wein Ist Gut," "Ein Wiener Waltz," "Frühling in Wien" and "Schonau." Orchestral selections will include four Johann Strauss works — The Radetzky March, "Perpetuum Mobile," the "Fledermaus" Waltz and the "Blue Danube."
