

Amusing Fantasy Scheduled For St. Valentine's Program

Gods Of Mythology Will Attempt To Bring Love-Making Technique Up To Date In Tuesday Night Broadcast

"Love and Kisses," an amusing fantasy in which the gods of mythology seek to bring their technique of love making up to date, will be broadcast over WJZ at 10:30 p. m., on St. Valentine's Day.

The play was written by Ronald MacDougall, young author who rose from operator of a mimeograph machine to a staff script writer at NBC. He has written several unusual fantasies that have all been hits when broadcast by the NBC.

In his Valentine comedy Jupiter imports a professor from earth to deliver lectures on modern ways, with emphasis on jitterbugs and necking. By mistake the professor brings Jimmy, a young soda jerker, along with him, and Jimmy throws the land of the gods into a turmoil when two goddesses, Diana and Venus, fall in love with him.

What happens when two crooks doublecross each other in love forms the basis of the "Johnny Presents" dramatization over WEAJ Tuesday, at 8 p. m. The story was written by Max Marcin, noted playwright, and directed by Jack Johnstone. They are Giovanni Martinelli, famed tenor of the Metropolitan Opera; Arthur Garfield Hayes, noted attorney and head of the American Civil Liberties Union and Ben Grauer, announcer on Kay Kyser's "College of Musical Knowledge."

Stamp collectors will take over the Battle of the Sexes program Tuesday, over WEAJ from 9.00 to 9:30 p. m. A team of men will compete against a group of women. Some of the outstanding philatelists in the country are slated to compete in this novel match with Frank Crumit and Julia Sanderson presiding.

Representing the male stamp collectors will be Ernest A. Kehr, editor of the Philatelic Journal, Sidney F Barrett, chairman of the Stamp Collectors Club of New York; and William J. McLoughlin and L. Bartlett Gatchell. On the women's team will be Mabel Stennett, secretary of the Philatelic Agency of the Post Office Department, Washington, D. C.; Mrs. Fay Jordon, social registerite and owner of the famous "Purple Stamp Collection." Mrs. Anna V. Elkins and Dr. Louise Larimore.

Jan Masaryk, Czechoslovakian diplomat and son of the Republic's first President, the late Dr. Thomas Masaryk, will expose himself to Clifton Fadiman's questions on the Information Please program Tuesday. Russel Crouse, playwright who struggled thru an earlier Information Please program, will be another guest to reinforce the regulars of the board of experts, John Kieran and Franklin P. Adams.

Raymond Paige has stated "casting" his 22 man orchestra for his new series which starts Feb. 22 over CBS. The broadcasts will emanate from New York using the enlarged stage of the former Ambassador Theatre now operated by the Columbia network.
