San Francisco's Golden Gate exposition will be formally opened Saturday by President Roosevelt.

Speaking from Key West, Fla., the nation's chief executive will join with Harry L. Hopkins, secretary of commerce; Leland W. Cutler, president of the exposition; Daniel C. Roper, former secretary of commerce; Mayor Angelo Rossi, of San Francisco; and Gov. Culbert L. Olson, of California in the opening day celebration. The broadcast is scheduled for 2 p. m. over stations WBBM and WCFL and at 2:30 p. m. through WGN and WLS.

Tonight Leopold Stokowski and the San Francisco Symphony orchestra will salute the exposition. The program includes Bach's "G Minor Fugue," and Brahms' "First Symphony in C Minor" and will be heard through station WIBA at 10:30 p. m.
