Larry Clinton's orchestra and swing songstress Bea Wain will provide the musical background.

Fred Waring and his Pennsylvanians will celebrate their 21st anniversary during the broadcast Saturday at 8:30 p. m. over WEAF. Organized at Penn State college in February, 1918, the Pennsylvania group still includes several of its original members, notably Poley McClintock. During the anniversary broadcast Waring will play "Old Maid Blues," a number popular in '18.

With the announcement that Arturo Toscanini will broadcast an all-Sibelius program with the NBC Symphony Orchestra on Saturday comes cause for special rejoicing among radio's millions who cultivate the art of enjoying great music. Everybody knows the tunes of this composer's "Finlandia" and "Valse Triste," but to radio's vast and ever-increasing symphony audience the name of Jean Sibelius recalls far more exciting pleasures. Four of the great Finnish master's works are listed for Saturday night's program, to be heard from 10 to 11:30 p. m. over WJZ and throughout the world via short wave. These are: the Second Symphony, "En Saga," "The Swan of Tuonela," and "Finlandia," that most popular of all Sibelius scores.
