

# Nick Lucas Will Be Heard On Al Pearce Hour Monday

Life Of Kit Carson To Be Dramalized On Cavalcade Of America; Richard Crooks Closing Series

Nick Lucas, crooning troubadour of stage and screen, will be the guest entertainer with Al Pearce and His Gang on their WEAf program Monday at 8:00 p. m. He will sing the old favorite, "Bye, Bye, Blackbird."

Al and the gang are not the type to wait until the last minute to attend to important affairs. Elmer Blurt, Arlene Harris, Vince Barnett, Tizzie Lish and Eb and Zeb will start worrying about their income tax on this program, with the due date almost a month away.

A highlight of the musical section of the program will be a special Carl Hoff arrangement of "Do You Ever Think of Me" by Hoff and his orchestra.

Highspots in the life of Kit Carson, explorer, guide and Indian fighter of the old west, will be dramatized on Cavalcade of America Monday.

Born in Madison-co, Kentucky, on Christmas Eve 1809, Carson started traveling early in life and never wholly settled down. While still a baby his parents loaded Kit and their household goods into a covered wagon and moved west to Howard-co, Missouri, then on the edge of the Indian country. He learned to ride and shoot as soon as he could walk.

At the age of 15 he became a saddler's apprentice, but his restless spirit demanded action and at the age of 17 he joined a wagon train headed for Santa Fe, New Mexico. From then on he was involved in one adventure after another. While still a young man Carson served as guide to Colonel John Charles Fremont, the explorer. Later he and Fremont fought thru the Mexican war together and helped add Cali-

fornia and the great Southwest to the continental empire.

Richard Crooks will give his final concert of this season from Radio City Monday at 8:30 p. m. over WEAf. He will be heard on the program four more times, however, while on a concert tour that will take him as far as Australia. Margaret Speaks, the program's soprano soloist, will be featured with the Firestone Symphony orchestra, conducted by Alfred Wallenstein, when the tenor is not on the program.

Crooks will sing four numbers in his broadcast, "Il mio tesoro," from Mozart's "Don Giovanni;" Quilter's "Now Sleeps the Crimson Petal;" Paladilhe's "J'ai dit aux étoiles," and Aylward's "Beloved, It is Morn." Wallenstein also will conduct the 70-piece orchestra in Beethoven's "Rakoczy March," Strauss' "Perpetuo Mobile" and Lehar's "Gold and Silver Waltz."

Eddie Cantor, who ever keeps anything from his public, will announce the name of the Santa Anita "sure thing" that Clem McCarthy gave him on last Monday's program. Eddie will sing "Romance Runs in the Family" while the rest of the cast play the parts of all the "Great Lovers" of history. Kay St. Germaine and Bert Parks will introduce a new version of the musical hit "Begin the Beguine."

Phil Spitalny and his all-girl Hour of Charm orchestra will present their version of favorite classical tunes which have brought fame to their composers when broadcasting from the stage of the Hippodrome theatre in Baltimore, Md., Monday, from 9 to 9:30 p. m., where the orchestra is making a personal appearance.

Titles of the songs which will feature the program are "Song of India" by Rimsky-Korsakov; "Air for the G String" by Bach; Wagner's "Evening Star"; "Traumerer" by Schumann and Schubert's "Serenade."

The program which also features Miss Dorothy Thompson, brilliant journalist, as news commentator, will emanate from station WFBR in Baltimore in a nation-wide hook-up with NBC's red network. Miss Thompson's talk on world events will be picked up from New York studios, and fed to the networks from Baltimore.
