WIFE REQUESTS DAMAGES FOR DEATH OF MATE

(Lima News Bureau) FINDLAY, Feb. 22 — A petition asking for damages for the death of her husband had been filed in common pleas court here today by Dorothy Reery against the Industrial Commission of Ohio and John Compton.

The petition alleges that Pearl Reery, the late husband of the plaintiff, died Aug. 10, 1935, a short time after he had sustained a skull fracture and other injuries in an accident while an employe of John Compton, of Findlay, doing business as the Associated Trade Press.

She charges further than Compton was employing five or more persons but that he failed to comply with the workmen's compensation law for their protection. The commission, she charges, has reviewed her claim and denied it.
