

Jack Haley Will Feature "Amazing Dr. Jitterbug"

Jamboree Broadcast Will Be Viewed By 1,700 Veterans At Chicago Hospital; Author Appears On Playhouse

Your man Friday—otherwise known as Jack Haley—will have the leading role in "The Amazing Dr. Jitterbug" or "A Scar is Born" in the broadcast Friday, at 7:30 p. m. over WABC.

The northwoods will provide the scenery for all the drama, because earlier in the program Wonder Boy Haley and his coterie, Lucille Ball, Virginia Verrill and Ted Fiorito, will wend their way to a hunting lodge in that section. Jack wants to escape the persecutions of his little niece, "The Dead End Girl". And it "could be" that Artie Auerbach will bob up on a bob sled to act as guide for the party.

Virginia Verrill will sing "Monday Morning on Saturday Night" and Ted Fiorito will lead his band in its famous specialty number, "Nola", and "We've Come a Long Ways".

More than 1700 veterans at the Edward Hines, Jr., Memorial Hospital, Chicago, will see as well as hear the NBC Jamboree broadcast when the entire company of NBC actors, singers and musicians moves to the main auditorium of the institution for the program at 8:30 p. m., over WJZ Friday.

With Tom Hargis directing and Don McNeill emceeing, the show will include specialties by Swor and Lubin, NBC blackface comedy team; Fran (Aunt Fanny) Allison;

Tenor Wayne Van Dyne, Contralto Lillian Cornell, Baritone Johnnie Johnston, and the Vagabonds, male quartet. Joseph Gallicchio will lead the orchestra.

Following the broadcast, Gene and Glenn, song and comedy team, will join the cast in presenting an additional hour of entertainment for the veterans.

Phil Strong, celebrated Iowa author of "State Fair," will play a leading role on the Playhouse Friday, when Orson Welles dramatizes Strong's own book. Welles himself will play the part of the late Will Rogers immortalized on the screen, while Strong will play the part of the storekeeper. "State Fair" was a leading motion picture of 1932. Its humor, pathos and drama will be captured by Welles in the radio dramatization of the story.

Les Tiemayne plays the manager of a Social Register-conscious prize fighter in the "Duke of London," a First Nighter presentation, Friday, 8:00 p. m. on WABC. Barbara Luddy's role is "Babs," daughter of a society matron who looks down on fisticuffs as a means of livelihood. Despite the failure of the prize fighter to make an appearance in the prize ring and other complications, Les meets Barbara, or Boy Meets Girl.

The twelve-round battle in Madison Square Garden between Lou Ambers, former world's lightweight champion, and Baby Arizmendi, former world's featherweight champion, will be described from the ringside Friday beginning at 10:00 p. m., over WJZ.

Sam Taub will give the blow-by-blow description of the fight between Ambers and Arizmendi — two of the fastest-fighting and hardest hitting "little men" of the ring. Bill Stern will provide the between-rounds color.

Many of the Warden Lawes' dramatizations have had to do with the psychology of prisoners and prison work. It is no news that his efforts have gained world-wide attention. However, Friday, when Warden Lawes will present the "Ten Percent" which reveals a curious aspect of prison life.

To be the story of Case History number 8902, the prisoner says . . . "I need protection even in prison. They say I double-crossed them . . . but they double-crossed me . . . I showed them and now they're sore."
